Activity Accident Basic Plan 1

Automatic Coverage Expanded

New changes to Activity Accident coverage – Effective 10/1/2023

Basic Plan 1 will <u>automatically</u> include:

- ✓ Non-member participants (invited attendees)
- ✓ ALL trips (including > 2 overnights)
 - ✓ Tagalongs (siblings /children)
- ✓ Younger children in Girl Scout supervised units

Plan 2 is eliminated!

Volunteers and staff will no longer need to individually purchase coverage for all the above!

Key Reminders (this has NOT changed):

- Tag-a-longs should be included in the adult:youth ratios.
- All adults who will be **supervising Girl Scouts in any way**, or **driving Girl Scouts**, even ONE time, must have a **membership/background check**.
- Adults who plan to attend more than 1-2 events, even in a nonsupervising role, should have a **membership/background check**.
- Potential youth members may join 1-2 activities to evaluate their interest, but then should register as members to continue participation as Girl Scouts.

Community partners are available on the Approved Activity Providers list. This list is updated often, so check it out when planning a troop outing!








