

### **Camp Properties**





#### Camp Gertrude Coleman in Trussville, Alabama,

is situated on approximately 140 acres along the Cahaba River and has provided outdoor adventure for thousands of Girl Scouts since 1925. Camp Gertrude Coleman consists of 34 wooden structures and is one of the longest continually operating Girl Scout camps in the nation. The camp has been in continuous operation since it opened in 1925, including during World War II when most camp facilities closed, and was listed in the Alabama Register of Landmarks and Heritage in 2013.



#### Camp Trico in Guntersville, Alabama,

is situated on 110 acres on the shores of beautiful Lake Guntersville, just 40 minutes southeast of Huntsville and less than an hour northwest of Gadsden. With over a mile of shoreline directly on Lake Guntersville, Camp Trico is GSNCA's premier location for water activities including swimming, canoeing, kayaking, tubing, sailing, watersports, water skiing, and stand-up paddleboards.



#### Camp Cottaquilla in White Plains, Alabama,

is located on 1600 acres of pristine unspoiled forest between Jacksonville and Anniston. Established in 1948, it's the largest of Girl Scouts of North-Central Alabama's properties. With its mountainous terrain and Appalachian flora and fauna, Camp Cottaquilla is the perfect spot for a variety of outdoor experiences. The property includes a sheltered private lake making Camp Cottaquilla and ideal place for girls to learn paddling skills, fishing, and much more.



#### Kanawahala Program Center in Chelsea, Alabama,

is located on 600 acres, just 33 minutes southeast of Birmingham and little more than an hour from Tuscaloosa. Kanawahala Program Center has a fully stocked 40-acre private lake surrounded by mountains and serenity. A Junior Olympic sized swimming pool, piers, and waterfront boat storage facilities provide for a variety of activities including swimming, canoeing, kayaking, watersports, and stand-up paddleboards.

#### Take Action:


Girls act to make the world a better place.






